

Initial Real Estate Broker License Application – Part A

The Louisiana Real Estate Commission ("Commission") has prescribed this *Initial Broker License Application* form, according to the Louisiana Real Estate License Law (La. R.S. 37:1430 et seq). The *Initial Broker License Application* form shall be answered completely, and any incomplete or inaccurate application or any application submitted without the appropriate, nonrefundable payment shall be considered unfiled.

Payment shall be made according to the Act and the fee schedule detailed below. Please also make payment to the Commission, payable to the: Louisiana Real Estate Commission. Company checks, personal checks, certified checks, and money orders are accepted. Please do not send cash via mail.
